



## Course Practice

The LPC is the second stage in your path to qualifying as a Solicitor. You can proceed directly on to this course if you already have a Qualifying Law Degree or have successfully completed the GDL

The LPC forms part of the vocational stage of training required if you wish to qualify as a Solicitor. The Solicitors Regulation Authority recognises this course as meeting its training requirements and covering the necessary legal topics.



You still need to complete the Period of Recognised Training (2 years), the Professional Skills Course (usually 2 weeks) and meet the SRA's character and suitability requirements (https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/handbook/suitabilitytest/content.page) prior to being eligible to qualify.

You need to have a "Qualifying Law Degree" (usually a law degree awarded by a recognised institution in England and Wales) or have completed the GDL in order to sit the LPC.
